





The present rates of Twin Valley Water Company became effective on April 1, 2007, pursuant to Resolution No. 92-07-093.

Assembly Bill 2995, in adding Section 4019.10 to the California Health and Safety Code, directs the Department of Health Services (DHS) to charge the utilities within its jurisdiction for all operating costs. The legislation also authorized these costs to be passed on to those utilities' customers. Commission Resolution W-4327, March 6,2002, authorizes Twin Valley Water Company to file the attached rate schedules, and to concurrently withdraw and cancel its present schedules for such service.

Twin Valley Water Company, Inc. has duly established the required Water Quality Memorandum Account (WQMA), and recorded there in the amount of \$_9857.85 representing expenses resulting from drinking water regulations, including water sampling, testing, reporting, and treatment costs paid by the company.

Twin Valley Water Company, Inc. requests permission to recover the above charges from its _90 customers by assessing a four-month surcharge of \$ 27.38 one-time surcharge of \$ 109.52 to each customer's bill spread over four months at \$27.38 surcharge per month. Workpapers justifying this charge have been provided to the CPUC Water Branch staff. This filing is made under the provisions of General Order No. 96-A.

Twin Valley Water Company, Inc. has given public notice of this request by publishing a notice in a Mailer to all Customers. A copy of the notice is attached. This filing will not cause withdrawal of service nor conflict with any other schedule or rule.

In compliance with Section III-G of General Order No. 96-A a copy of this advice letter has been mailed to the San Martin Water, an adjacent water utility.

NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS December 1, 2007

Twin Valley Water Company hereby notifies the public that it has requested authority from the California Public Utilities Commission to impose a one-time surcharge of \$ 9857.85. The increase is for the purpose of passing on to customers the Department of Health Services (DHS) fee assessed/Billed to Twin Valley Water Company from the December 2003 to November 14, 2007. By adding Section 4019.10 to the Health and Safety Code, Assembly Bill 2995 authorizes utilities to pass the operating costs of DHS and Environmental Protection Agency's adopted National Primary Drinking Water Regulations for water testing and to maintain standards under the Surface Water Treatment Rule to its Customers. The resulting rates would not result in a rate of return in excess of that last found reasonable for Twin Valley Water Company.

To recover the assessed expenses, the water system has requested a one-time surcharge of \$_109.53 per customer. Customers will see this, or a Commission approved charge, on four monthly bills of \$27.38 soon after Commission approval has been obtained.
