Revised Demand Management Measures

AB 2067 (2014) reduced DMM reporting from 14 measures to 7:

- Water Waste Ordinances
- 2. Metering
- 3. Conservation Pricing
- 4. Public Education and Outreach
- 5. Water Loss Programs
- 6. Conservation Coordinators
- 7. Other Significant Impact





Electronic Data Reporting

SB 1420(2014)- Required urban water suppliers to submit UWMP data electronically using standardized tables

- 2015 Guidebook includes standardized tables
- New on line reporting tool





Water Loss Reporting

SB 1420 (2014) requires water suppliers to report to report on distribution system water loss.

- Water Loss Audit Manual (Appendix L)
- Water Loss Collaborative- Cal Nev AWWA, CUWCC, US EPA, DWR





20x2020 Compliance Year Adjustments

SB X7-7 allows water suppliers to adjust compliance year water use due to:

- Weather differences
- Economic growth
- Extraordinary event

DWR has developed a methodology and weather normalization tools to complete these adjustments





Voluntary Methodologies

- SB 1420(2014) methodology on estimating future demands accounting for water savings from codes and standards
- SB 1036(2014) methodology on calculating water supply energy intensity

Annual Water Loss Reporting

- SB 555(2015) requires water suppliers to submit validated water loss audits annually starting in October 2017.
- DWR to develop guidelines for validation and reporting by January 2017.





Revised Landscape Ordinance

- Governor's April 1st Drought Executive Order directed DWR to revise the state's landscape ordinance
- Revised ordinance approved by CA Water Commission on July 15
- Local land use agencies have to take action by December 1st or February 1st for regional ordinances
- Reduced the water budget for new residential landscape by 20% and 35% for commercial landscapes





Turf and Toilet Rebates

- Funds still available as of Nov 1:
 - \$15.8M for turf
 - \$4.3M for toilets
