For Your Lawn:


- Set your lawn mower to a higher height setting. Longer grass keeps the soil moist.
- Aerate your soil at least once a year to help water penetrate deeper into soil.

For Your Plants and Trees:

- Install drip irrigation so water only goes where it is needed.
- Use mulch and compost to help retain water so irrigation is needed less often.

The State Water Resources Control Board's drought regulations ban outdoor watering for 48 hours after measurable rain. Please adjust your irrigation controllers accordingly and refrain from hand watering for 48 hours after any rain.


