AUSTIN ALEXANDER

ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAMON CONNOLLY

California State Assemblymember Damon Connolly has worked in public service for more than 18 years as a Marin County Supervisor, Vice-Mayor of San Rafael, School Board President, and California Deputy Attorney General.

As Supervisor, he protected open spaces while increasing the availability of affordable housing; set Marin County on a path toward 100% renewable energy while keeping the County's fiscal house in order; and spearheaded responses to homelessness while expanding access to public transit and infrastructure for bicyclists and pedestrians.

Prior to serving on the Board of Supervisors, Damon served as the Vice Mayor of San Rafael, a two-term San Rafael City Councilmember, and former School Board Presi-

dent. He was a founding board member of Marin Clean Energy (MCE) and served as Chair of the Board of Directors from June 2011 to November 2014.

Before opening his own law practice in San Rafael, Damon was a Supervising Deputy California Attorney General, prosecuting the energy companies that gouged our state during the energy crisis of 2000-2001.

Damon has served as the President of the Workforce Alliance of the North Bay. He is also a Member of the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, Marin County Housing Authority, and Marin County Open Space District. Damon also serves as Marin County's representative on the Metropolitan Transportation Commission.

Damon is a Bay Area native, attending college and law school at UC Berkeley. He has lived in San Rafael for the past twenty-five years with his wife, Dawn and their two daughters.



SENATOR DAVE CORTESE

Senator Dave Cortese was elected in November of 2020 to represent State Senate District 15 which encompasses much of Santa Clara County in the heart of Silicon Valley. Along with his accomplished career as an attorney and business owner, the Senator previously served on the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors for over a decade, with four years as Board President, on the San Jose City Council for eight years, including two years as Vice Mayor, and as a trustee for the East Side Union High School District for eight years.

He grew up in San Jose as part of a family that has been active in civic, cultural, and business activities for generations. Dave graduated from Bellarmine College Preparatory then University of California, Davis where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Political Science. He earned his Juris Doctorate at Lincoln University Law School in San Jose. He has four children and is married to his wife Pattie Cortese who is currently a Trustee on the Eastside Union High School Board.

During his nearly three decades in public service, Dave has brought the community together to address and reduce homelessness, combat climate change, expand public transit options, reform Santa Clara County's jail custody operations, and fight for the rights of immigrants.

As a California State Senator, Dave intends to continue and expand on the successful work he has done in Santa Clara County and apply as many solutions as possible statewide. That includes addressing climate change through building decarbonization, increasing California's housing stock, shifting the focus of our justice system from incarceration to rehabilitation, and fighting sexual assault and gender-based violence.



ADAM COUGHRAN

Adam Coughran is an industry leader in safety and security training for schools, businesses, and large organizations. Adam is a veteran of Southern California law enforcement who utilized his expertise to found Standards Training Group and Safe Kids Inc., businesses dedicated to helping prevent workplace crime and violence. He is a frequent contributor to national media on the issue of workplace

violence, appearing on the Today Show, Good Morning America, FOX's Nancy Grace, HLN's MichaelA, and CBS This Morning. He is also a contributing author to Newsweek Magazine.



PHILIP DEVLIEGHER

He had been the Water Quality Manager for the City of Pasadena Water and Power Department, the Water Quality & Laboratory Supervisor for the Castaic Lake Water Agency (now the Santa Clarita Valley Water Agency), and a Public Health Chemist with the California Environmental Protection Agency. He is the author of many papers on the environmental analysis of air, water, and solids, drinking water disinfection & microbiology, source identification of environmental contaminants, and environmental policy. He has served on various committees for professional organizations such as the American Water Works Association and the Association of California Water Agencies. He founded and was president of the Coalition of Accredited Laboratories. He has served on the Federal Advisory Committee on Detection and Quantitation for Clean Water Act which advised the USEPA on laboratory reporting procedures. He also advised the California Department of Public Health on the Reporting Limits Work Group on the issues of detection and quantitation in laboratory analysis for the Safe Drinking Water Act compliance. He has been the laboratory director of two laboratories accredited by the Environmental Laboratory Accreditation Program (ELAP) and oversaw the accreditation of one laboratory to the ELAP's TNI Minus 2 program. He has written extensively on laboratory accreditation issues including TNI.



SENATOR JOHN LAIRD

John Laird was elected to the State Senate on November 3, 2020, carrying all four counties in the district with a combined margin of over 145,000 votes, and was sworn in to represent Senate District 17 on December 7, 2020. In the

State Senate, Laird chairs and serves on a broad array of committees: Chair, Senate Budget Subcommittee #1 (Education), Vice Chair, Joint Committee on Rules, Member, Budget & Fiscal Review Committee, Member, Judiciary Committee, Member, Labor, Public Employment & Retirement, Member, Natural Resources & Water Committee, Member, Rules Committee, Member, Joint Legislative Audit Committee.

Prior to his Senate service, Laird served as Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency under Governor Jerry Brown from January 5, 2011 until January 7, 2019. Laird also served as a member of the State Integrated Waste Management Board from 2008 to 2009. In 2002, he was elected to the State Assembly to represent the 27th District, which included portions of Monterey, Santa Clara and Santa Cruz Counties, and was reelected in 2004 and 2006. While serving the maximum three terms in the Assembly, Laird authored 82 bills that were signed into law.

Prior to serving in the State Assembly, Laird was elected as a member of the Cabrillo College Board of Trustees from 1994 to 2002. In 1981, Laird was elected to the Santa Cruz City Council, and served nine years until term limits ended his council service in 1990. He was a two-term mayor from 1983 to 1984 and from 1987 to 1988, making him one of the first openly gay mayors to serve in the United States.

Laird has also served as executive director of the Santa Cruz AIDS Project, taught environmental policy at the University of California Santa Cruz, hosted a news talk program on KUSP public radio, and held analyst positions in budgeting and human resources for the County of Santa Cruz.

The son of teachers and raised in Vallejo, Laird graduated with honors in politics from the University of California – Santa Cruz in 1972. He has been a long-time resident of Santa Cruz with his spouse John Flores. He has traveled extensively, is fluent in Spanish, enjoys conducting family history research, and is a life-long Chicago Cubs fan.
